

Wek'èezhì Renewable Resources Board (WRRB)

Work Plan for Bluenose-East Caribou Herd Management Proposal

Dated: March 1, 2019

Purpose of the Work Plan

To outline the processes and timelines to be followed for the Bluenose-East caribou herd joint management proposal.

Background

In June and July 2018, aerial reconnaissance, composition and photo surveys were conducted on the Bluenose-East caribou herd. The final breeding female and population estimates, available on November 20, 2018, indicate that the herd has declined by 50% since 2015.

On January 14, 2019, Environment & Natural Resources (ENR), Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) and Tłı̨chq̓ Government (TG) submitted a joint management proposal, entitled *"Joint Proposal on Management Actions for the Bluenose-East ̑ekwò (Barren-ground caribou) Herd 2019-2021"*.

Scope of the Proceeding

The primary objective of this Proceeding is to determine and/or recommend management actions for the Bluenose-East caribou herd in Wek'èezhì, including a total allowable harvest and harvest allocation.

Guiding Principles

The following principles will guide the Work Plan throughout this Proceeding:

- The Board will act in the public interest (Sections 12.1.2, Tłı̨chq̓ Agreement), including subsistence, resident, non-resident and commercial harvesters;
- The management proposal process shall have regard for the principles and practices of conservation and the importance of wildlife and its habitat to the Tłı̨chq̓ First Nation well-being, way of life and land-based economy (Sections 12.1.5.a and 12.1.1, Tłı̨chq̓ Agreement);
- The management proposal process shall take steps to acquire and use traditional knowledge as well as other types of scientific information and expert opinion (Section 12.1.6, Tłı̨chq̓ Agreement);
- The management proposal process shall be carried out in a timely manner;
- The Board will review the joint management proposal and consider potential management actions based on evidence and rationale submitted by ENR, TG or any other Party; and,
- The Board will review the joint management proposal and consider potential management actions in order to meet the Board's mandate (mission) and applicable policies

Work Plan Objectives

The Work Plan is to achieve the following objectives:

- Compile a broad range of focused input through the Proceeding;
- Ensure adequate information is gathered to complete the management proposal process;
- Facilitate a thorough, inclusive and timely management proposal process; and,

- Determine and/or recommend management actions to conserve the Bluenose-East caribou herd.

Opportunities for Community Engagement

- The Board required ENR and TG to inform and engage with communities and Indigenous organizations regarding the joint management proposal submission;
- The Board will include a notification(s) regarding the management proposal process in the newspaper, community radio (CBC, CKLB, CJCD, Taiga), Board website, including public registry and social media (Facebook);
- The Board will coordinate a technical session or sessions, if required, to address specific issues that require more focused review and discussion;
- The Board will hold a public hearing; and
- The Board will hold any other consultation or engagement activity that the Board considers appropriate.

Materials Circulated for Comment by Parties

During the course of this Proceeding, the Board, along with Staff assistance, will review all evidence filed by the Parties. These efforts are intended to identify issues or concerns which must be addressed in the joint management proposal and to resolve them, if possible, before the close of the Proceeding. This process allows Parties to address the proposed management actions for the Bluenose-East caribou herd in their presentations to the Board and to prepare arguments setting out their positions with respect to these provisions at the close of the Proceeding.

The Board is not bound by the contents of any of these draft materials and will make its decision at the close of the Proceeding on the basis of all evidence and arguments filed by all Parties.
