Re: Kok'èetì Ekwò (Bathurst Caribou) 2022 Action Plan

Dear Ms. Sayine-Crawford:

The Wek'èezhìì Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) has a mandate for wildlife, plants, forests, and protected areas in Wek'èezhìì and adheres to the principles and practices of conservation in fulfilling its duties. The Board makes decisions and recommendations on an ecosystemic basis using Tłįchǫ knowledge, science, and expert opinion. At its recent September 2022 meeting, the Board reviewed the *Annual Review on Bathurst Caribou – 2022 Action Plan*, which was submitted by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR), Government of the Northwest Territories as a wildlife management proposal on August 16, 2022.

The WRRB understands that the main goal of the 2022 Action Plan, which was developed collaboratively by the Bathurst Caribou Advisory Committee (BCAC) at its 2021 Annual Review, is to determine the Kǫk'èetì Ekwò herd's status based all relevant Indigenous, community, and scientific information shared and recommend management responses for the coming year. The Board understands that BCAC determined the herd status to be "critical low" and recommended a suite of managements actions for harvest, predators, research and monitoring, habitat and disturbance, and communication and education. As such, the WRRB approves the Bathurst Caribou 2022 Action Plan as presented (Motion #825-14-09-2022).

In order to support appropriate implementation in the future, the WRRB recommends that ENR and BCAC develop and submit the annual Action Plan by no later than March 31st of each year. The WRRB looks forward to continuing to work with ENR and BCAC for the management of the Kok'èetì Ekwò herd.
